BACKGROUND

- The <u>Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB)</u> <u>accepted</u> the <u>2019 Mid-term</u> <u>Transportation Needs</u> in January, 2020
- At that time, the CTB also directed the Office of Intermodal Planning and Investment to Prioritize the 2019 Mid-term Transportation Needs





BACKGROUND

- In VTrans, needs are identified for two planning horizons.
 - Mid-term
 - Long-term

Planning Horizon	• 7 - 10 years	• 10 – 25 years
Purpose	 Screen SMART SCALE applications Prioritize VDOT Revenue Sharing applications Forms the basis of VTrans Multimodal Project Study Pipeline 	 Inform policy to prepare for gradual and systematic change
Board Action	Adopted in January 2020	Requested in 2021



PRIORITIZATION OF VTRANS MID-TERM NEEDS | CONTEXT AND SIGNIFICANCE

- Based on the CTB's direction, the Prioritized Mid-term Needs may be used to:
 - Inform VDOT and DRPT's investments in planning and project development activities
 - Develop of policies related to transportation programs and activities
 - Inform other programmatic or planning related functions
- Finally, local and regional planning agencies may utilize the prioritized Needs to inform local and regional planning efforts.




CONTEXT AND OVERVIEW | EFFORTS TO DATE

July 2020: Presentation: Approach for the Prioritization of the VTrans Mid-term Needs



STEP 3

Weigh and Aggregate Needs across Needs Categories Identify Commonwealth and District-Priority locations by applying weights to VTrans Need categories

STEP 4

Adjust Priorities for Influencing Factors

Adjust the Commonwealth and District Priority locations by considering the following influencing factors

- Co-located bridge and pavement repair, rehabilitation, or replacement needs
- Exposure to Sea-level Rise, Storm Surge and Inland/Riverine Flooding


